## What makes a ground surface accessible?







Certification-Built Environment



While the federal accessibility standards and state building codes require accessible surfaces to be firm, stable, and slip-resistant, the standards do not specify a test method to objectively measure various surfaces such as carpets; vinyl; decking; synthetic sport surfaces; engineered wood fiber, poured-in-place rubber, crumb rubber, and hybrid systems with an overlay over loose fill material or padding used on playgrounds; portable path and modular decking used on beaches; and crushed limestone, decomposed granite, and surface stabilizers used on pedestrian trails.
