Architect Karen L. Braitmayer, FAIA, APAC-BE, is the founding principal of the accessibility consulting firm Studio Pacifica based in Seattle, Washington.

Her "good fight" has consistently focused on supporting equity and full inclusion for persons with disabilities. In 2019, she was chosen as the national winner of the AIA Whitney M. Young, Jr., award —a prestigious award given to an architect who "embodies social responsibility and actively addresses a relevant issue." In the award's 48-year history, she was the first recipient honored for their work in the area of civil rights for persons with disabilities. Braitmayer was also appointed by President Barack Obama to the United States Access Board, a position she held from 2010 to July of 2023.

DOE poised to strike down accessibility standards

The United States Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to rescind the requirements in 10 CFR 1040.73 which require that new construction not discriminate against people with disabilities. The DOE is relying on another provision in 10 CFR 1040.71 that is general in stating that no "handicapped" person shall be excluded from participation or subject to discrimination.



The proposed rule is a "Direct Final Rule," meaning that it will go into effect on July 15, 2025, without the customary comment periods. The current requirement in 10 CFR 1040.73 states

that new construction must be in accordance with the Uniform Federal Accessibility Standards (UFAS). Although the UFAS is almost half a century old, it is still more than what would be in place if the rule is allowed to proceed.

To reset the process, "significant adverse comments" would need to be received by DOE by **June 16, 2025**; just a few weeks from today. If you or your organization would like to file comments, that must be done through the Federal eRulemaking Portal. For additional information, <u>click here</u>.

The APA Technical Standards and Legislative and Legal Committees will be composing comments to be submitted on behalf of APA.

APA advocates for clearer processes and reduced administrative burdens for RAS

The Accessibility Professionals Association (APA), on behalf of its Texas Chapter (APA TXC), recently submitted a formal letter to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) raising concerns about procedural changes within the Architectural Barriers (AB) section. These unofficial practices have significantly increased administrative demands on Registered Accessibility Specialists (RAS), including tasks not outlined in the AB Administrative Rules, such as verifying property ownership and managing file closures.

<u>APA's letter</u> calls for a collaborative resolution to align departmental procedures with the law and better support RAS in their core duties: ensuring accessibility compliance. The letter offers constructive recommendations, such as streamlining closure requirements, clarifying responsibilities, and improving consistency in documentation practices.

TDLR has responded to the APA TXC letter, and a dialogue is now underway. This is a crucial opportunity to ensure the voices of RAS professionals are heard and considered as part of the ongoing conversation.
